Support A Child (SAC) is a Unique Initiative

I have been serving SAC project for 8 years. I am very thrilled and proud to declare that we have established a transparent and efficient mechanism of selecting children, following up with the progress of children and hostels and delivering to our donors and supporters.

We have a dedicated team of volunteers and office managers in Bharat and in the USA. SAC USA receives report card of each child between August to November each year. Each report card is scanned, stored, and then sent to our donors in month of January / February. If a donor says he/she did not receive the report card of the child they supported, it is then emailed to the donor. In case a child is replaced, SAC office sends the profile of new child assigned along with the information of the previous child.

Students enrolled and with an updated report card are the ones supported by SAC. SAC volunteers visit SAC supported hostels in Bharat. I have personally visited 30 hostels in 11 states and it was very satisfactory.

I appreciate all our volunteers, chapter coordinators, core team members, supporters, and donors.

SAC Report from USA

Support-A-Child (SAC) is a Seva initiative of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad of America (VHPA). This program has been running since 1985 and works to provide education, lodging and boarding to children from poor families from India, including rural and remote tribal regions that lack basic amenities. SAC is a volunteer-run non-profit organization with 27 chapters across 16 states in the US. Volunteers from the SAC national team and individual chapters work together to organize fund raisers across the US. SAC volunteers work very hard to bring talented professional artists from India to perform at these fund raisers. SAC proudly pursues the lofty goal of helping needy children of India, while promoting Indian art and culture in the US.

SAC strives to ensure that all donations received reach their intended recipients, with minimal overhead spending. SAC collaborates with various organizations in India such as Bharat Kalyan Prathishthan (BKP), Sewa Bharati, Sewa Dham, Vivekanand Kendra and Seva in Action. BKP, which is a project of VHP, is one of the main partners of SAC. BKP runs several hostels in cities as well as in remote villages and tribal regions of India, which is one of the most neglected populations. Poverty and lack of resources in remote regions prevent youth from getting any education. To address this gap, SAC supported hostels and schools are operating in remote areas of Manipur, Tripura, Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Assam, West Bengal, Rajasthan, Gujarat and Andhra Pradesh. This year we increased our footprint by adding 17 Sewa Bharati institutions in our recipient list.

Operations:

With the pandemic behind us, volunteers enthusiastically came together to resume in-person fundraisers. Thanks to the generosity of SAC donors, we are on track to reach our goal to support 4500 children in India in the current year. SAC donors have shown commendable support and compassion during the pandemic – opening their hearts and their purses when help was most needed. With the blessings of our donors, the goal for the next year 2023 is to support 5000 children.

In spite of all odds, we managed to raise and send the total amount of \$507,331.76 to Bharat in year 2021.


Year at a Glance 2022 Fundraisers:

During the two years of pandemic, 2020 and 2021, SAC had switched to virtual performances for fund raising events. Artists performed in virtual live shows that were telecast for American audiences. These shows were very well received, helping raise awareness about the SAC initiative as well as raising funds. With international travel allowed, Indian artists were able to perform in US in person this year. A talented troupe of dancers, lead by Dr. Sucharita Khanna of the Kalanidhi Center of Performing Arts was invited for this year's fundraiser. Dr. Sucharita Khanna is a teacher



and an artist par excellence, trained in Bharatnatyam. Her show "Khanak," presenting various forms of dances from all over Bharat, enthralled the audiences across the US, in each and every performance. The shows were showered with praise for stellar performances as well as the excellent audio-visual arrangement. The efforts of volunteers from each SAC chapter could be seen in the flawless execution of each show. SAC youth wing and Balvihar students also volunteered at these fundraisers. SAC performances are chosen to cater to a very wide range of ages, from school children to senior citizens – dance and music has the capacity to blur age barriers. By involving youth, as volunteers and audience in these events, SAC seeks to inculcate the spirit of "service to humanity is service to God" at a young age, helping not just the children of Bharat, but the children here also become better human beings.

Kerala Rising and Shining Among Challenges

THE HISTORY

Kerala is known for its beaches, greenery, tea gardens and game centuries. At the same time Kerala is birthplace of Adi Shankaracharya, Great Swami Chinmayananda ji and home of many famous temples.

Travancore was very well ruled by the Kings like Marthanda Varma, Dharma Raja and others who followed from 1729 to 1949. They modernized agriculture, healthcare, road and transport system, education, electricity, water supply, public welfare, social justice etc. Despite such services, presence of treasure worth billions in the underground vaults of Sree Padmanabhan Swamy temple at Trivandrum points to the reality that the rulers of Kerala were honest, prudent, and cared for the next generation. After gaining independence the state of Kerala came into existence on 01 Nov 1956 by joining Malabar, Kochi, and Travancore.

It is believed that St. Thomas reached Kerala in A.D. 54. Local rulers were particular to ensure that the Christians enjoyed the status of Hindus in the society. Similarly, the Jews arrived Kerala in A.D. 60. About 10,000 of them settled at different parts of Kerala. Both the Christians and Jews very soon progressed financially and by virtue of such growth they gained special status from the Kings.

With the arrival of Vasco-da-Gama at Kozhikode in May 1498 and arrival of Dutch in 1658, many Hindus converted into Christianity. Similarly, with the arrival of Haider Ali and Tipu Sultan in the middle of 18th century Islam spread very rapidly in Kerala. They converted large number of Hindus to Islam by force and killed hundreds who refused to convert. They captured their ladies, ill-treated them. The ladies and their children were later sold as slaves in the open. A good number of Muslims from Malabar stood with Tipu Sultan and committed atrocities against the Hindus. That resulted in developing into hatred among the Hindus and Muslims in Malabar.

Following the Dutch, the British arrived in India. In 1723 the East India Company entered into an agreement with the King of Travancore. The agreement was first of its kind signed by an Indian King and the English East India Company. Later, they spread all over Kerala.

PRESENT SITUATION

Hindus, though more than 50% in number face constant discrimination, poverty, and threats. They are target of love jihad and land jihad, while other groups enjoy the status and privileges of minority. Hindus have just 20% share in the jobs abroad, they have 24% share of all business in Kerala. Hindus have less than 30% share in education. Due to love and land jihad, Hindus are losing the ownership of their own homes and ancestral lands. Their holding is less than 30%. In addition, 92% of suicides are committed by Hindus. Rule of Communist party in Kerala has worked against the welfare of Hindus.

Keral Pranth has 14 districts and SVCS is active in all those districts. Other functional organizations of VHP are 22 Trust and Societies, 131 Temples, 21 Schools, 4 Balika Sadans, 6 Balashrams, 2 Old age homes, 6 Bhajan Madhs, 5 Sanyas Ashrams and 119 Self Help Group Societies. 3 Bala/Balika Sadans and 2 Old age homes are under construction.

Of the 131 temples, a few are major temples but majority are small temples. 5 temples have got 12AB registered as per the Income Tax Rules. The Balasrams and Balika Sadans(Orphanages) are governed by Swami Vivekananda Cultural Society (SVCS) and has FCRA approval. Separate Trusts have now been registered to administer the Temples and Self Help Group Societies.

SVCS now has 4 Balikasrams and 6 Balasrams. Present strength of the students is 186.

Three more Balasrams are under construction.

Swami Vivekanand Cultural Society of Kerala and Support A Child (SAC) have been working from last few years to develop hostels for underprivileged boys and girls and skills development centers. SAC supports over 135 boys and girls, who are studying in various hostels in Kerala. SAC plans to increase them every year.

ASHOK SINGHAL KAUSHAL VIKAS KENDRA

SAC has opened two tailoring and computer skills training center in year 2021-22. These centers have imparted free training to over 200 ladies in computer usage and tailoring. Those who pass out from these centers are encouraged to start self help groups and a Trust (Viswasree Trust). This trust is registered to provide them guidance and financial assistance to groom them as entrepreneurs. Three units have already come up with such assistance.

1) ASHOK SINGHAL KAUSHAL VIKAS KENDRAM - ELEMBULASSERY, PALAKKADU

The first batch of trainees of computer and tailoring completed their training on 31 March 2022, upon successful completion of this 6 months course. 18th Anniversary celebration of Dakshayani Balashram was held together with passing out ceremony of the first batch of Computer and Tailoring course students under the Ashok Singhal Kaushal Vikas Kendra in Palghat district, Kerala. SAC USA extended financial support for this skill development center.

SUCCESS STORY

Employment Generation – Tailoring Unit

20 ladies who have completed Tailoring course here have decided to start an apparel manufacturing unit and are in the process of forming a co-operative society. They plan to approach the bank with project report and SVCS will provide them required help at each stage including working place, business canvassing and publicity.

Employment Generation – Computer Training Unit

Four students from the first group who completed the 6 months computer course from the Ashok Singhal Kaushal Vikas Kendra at Elumpilasseri (Palghat) started a COMMON SERVICE CENTRE at Karimpuzha Panchayat in Palghat, They have now secured Govt. recognition for their Centre as a Training Centre under PMGDISHA (Prime Minister's Grameen Digital Saksharta Abhiyan). Every student joining for computer training will be given a 20 hrs. training and then an online Web Camera examination will be conducted. Those passing the examination will be issued with a government recognized certificate.

Ashok Singhal Kaushal Vikas Kendram - Pullad, Pattanamathitta

Tailoring and Computer Skill Development Centre, Pullad, Pattanamthitta district was inaugurated on 28th February 2022 by Shri Madhukar ji Dixit. This is second unit supported by SAC USA for computer and tailoring skills to the local youth and our hostelites. Over 50 people have applied to join the courses for the classes that commenced from March 14th 2022.

SAC IS SUPPORTING TWO MORE CENTERS IN EARLY 2023

- 1) A training Centre for Mobile phone repairs. Sale and service of mobile phone is a business totally in control of a particular community. A large number of girls are falling for menaces like love jihad are lead through such centers.
- 2) A center to impart training for the production and sale of items being used for poojas such as oil, camphor, bathis etc, which are commonly used in temples and at home. 100% of such products that are now available in market are impure and hazardous.

Sewa Bharati Bal Vidyalaya in Mahesh Nagar Jaipur, home of 21 girls, 14 boys and school of 325 students, is very encouraging and inspirational initiative. Mrs. Vimla Kumawat ji established this school/hostel 19 years back. This is result of her very consistent hard work and determination. She used to visit slums of Jaipur, who were collecting garbage and parents had no clue of hygiene or education. Vimla ji used to pick up children, bring them home, give them shower, teach values in the life, and gave importance of education. She faced huge opposition from her own family and parents of slums. Parent's argument was if their children go to school who will collect trash for them. Both her family and slum people thought after some time Vimala Kumawat ji will give up her craziness. But Vimla ji left her home, took 21 girls with her and started living in a makeshift home and started taking them to school. Vimla ji also studied with girls. Vimla ji is called Dadi (Grand Mother) by all the students. Many girls are going to college, working, and even married. They are so thankful to Vimla ji for a better life. These girls are also expert in music, dance, and other activities.

We had the pleasure to visit the hostel in February 2022. It was very memorable experience. We are confident that this hostel, supported by SAC will educate, help, inspire and guide many girls in need and shape up their lives. Vima Kumawat ji an amazing person with a dedicated mission and action. She left her family and society to help these girls.

Seva Kunj Girls Hostel Pratap Nagar, Santdham Road (Jodhpur)

During our visit to Bharat in March 2022, we had wonderful opportunity to visit girl's hostel in Jodhpur. This unique hostel is home of nineteen girls who are from Jaisalmer, Barmer and Jodhpur area.

It was intresting to learn about the criteria for acceptance in hostel. First, these girls must come from below poverty line families. They are required to take entrance exam for language and math. The classes offered are from fifth grade to high school. We were extremely impressed with the girls, they were all smart, disciplined, and self-motivated. They follow very tight daily schedule from 5 am to 9 pm. They participate in all hostel activities and chores and attend nearby Adarsh Vidya Mandir school.

When we reached the hostel, it was the prayer time. Hostel has a small mandir room. All girls recited shloka and sang very melodious patriotic inspirational songs. Besides music girls also learn sewing and Mehndi art. A teacher Anju ji visits hostel weekly and assist girls in homework. This hostel was established in 2018, therefore not much data available. The hostel staff plans to send girls for higher college who qualify and provide different vocational training.

Puja Dubey is a young very energetic warden of the hostels. She spends all the time in the hostel. Even though the hostel is home of nineteen girls, they plan to increase the capacity to 50-60 girls. The hostel building is newly constructed and full of modern facilities. Hostel has huge lawn in the center surrounded with rooms of girls. Five girls share each room.

Girls do visit their home once a while. Many girls shared with us their personal struggle with poverty and the domestic issue such as alcoholic fathers. I saw sharp vision and hope for bright future in their eyes.











Visiting Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir, Delhi BY NEELAM JAISWAL

I am pleased to share my experience visiting one of the Support A Child supported hostel in Delhi - "Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir", a residential school for Boys. Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir provides free education, lodging, food and health care to attending students. There are about 300 students in 6th to 12th grade who live and study here. Majority of the students are from North East, Bihar and Jharkhand. Every year about 60 students are selected for 6th grade after going through entrance exam in different states. School has set up eligibility criteria for appearing in entrance exams. After joining the school, students start their life in a cultured and disciplined comprehensive environment at Sewa Dham campus.

We got the opportunity to participate in the morning prayer in assembly hall. We were amazed to see how disciplined these students were. I also got the opportunity to talk to the students per request of the Principal of the school Mr Rajendra Singh Negi ji. Students were excited to know that I am a Scientist in USA and also raising funds for them so that they can all study and be a responsible citizen

Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir is spread on a 5-acre land with huge outdoor facility for sports. We got to visit their dining hall, kitchen, hostel rooms and outdoor sports facility. We came to know that some of the teachers and mentors are previous students from this school. Now they are devoting their time to guide these students. Beside doing regular curriculum, these students are also trained in Artificial Intelligence, Soft Skill Developments and have Robotics team, computer labs and participate in different sports. Their Robotics team "Kalam Team Lab" earned fourth position in National First Tech Challenge (FTC) 2019-20 competition in Pune.

Sewa Dham Vidya Mandir have qualified and experienced coaches to provide training to students in games like kho-kho and football. This school is an active partner of well-known football academy – Signature Football Club (FC) Delhi and play with different teams at National level. School principal shared with us that that students passed from this school are doing exceptionally well and are posted in higher positions in different parts of Bharat. It was a great experience to see the children's enthusiasm for learning in a open, temporary classroom at the side of a very busy road. They clean the area themselves every day and start the class. I took a game and some packed refreshments for the children. Babulal ji is very dedicated and hard working person, it was a pleasure to meet him and his team there.
